Whose Voice are You Listening To?





The Parallel between Israel and the Church Pt 1

taken from the Pentecostal Bible Study Course



When we realize that the Scriptures reveal a parallel between Israel and the church, we have a valuable principle for understanding the Word of God. God gave about two-thirds of the Bible to Israel. Unless some of the same promises apply to the church spiritually, the church would have very little of the Bible left to claim as its own. In Scripture, we find that the church enjoys many promises made to God's chosen people, sometimes even before they are fulfilled in Israel.

The first question to consider is, What people belong to Israel, and what people belong to the church? Israel consists of the natural descendants of Abraham through Isaac and Jacob, while the church consists of born-again Jews and Gentiles, the spiritual descendants of Abraham through Christ.

Paul's kinsmen were "Israelites; to whom pertaineth the adoption, and the glory, and the covenants, and the giving of the law, and the service of God, and the promises" (Romans 9:4). The second question to consider is, If these things belong to Israel, how do they apply to the church? Indeed, how does the church perform the service of God or share in the glory? Importantly, which promises can the church claim?

We find the answer to these questions in realizing that Abraham had both natural and spiritual descendants. God promised Abraham, "That in blessing I will bless thee, and in multiplying I will multiply thy seed as the stars of the heaven, and as the sand which is upon the sea shore" (Genesis 22:17). God pictured the offspring of Abraham both as the sands of the sea and as the stars of heaven. This possibly indicates that his offspring would be a heavenly people as well as an earthly people.

Paul said that God gave the glory and the promises to Israel. Yet he also said that Israel rejected the Christ; this sounds as though the plan of God failed! Paul was careful to explain, however: "Not as though the word of God hath taken none effect. For they are not all Israel, which are of Israel" (Romans 9:6). In other words, Jews by birth do not necessarily count as the true seed. No, God's Word did not fail, even though Jesus "came unto his own, and his own received him not" (John 1:11). The Lord, however, did find a seed that would serve Him. "A seed shall serve him; it shall be accounted to the Lord for a generation" (Psalm 22:30).

Romans 9:7-8 says that the true seed of

the devil and the Lord.

How much has God given us that is ours to possess? Such as freedom and peace of mind, revival in our homes, church and city, wonderful things of prosperity from God, blessings and miracles. Yes how much has God told you of the things He has for you but the devil says no you can't have that because you're not big enough or strong enough. But God is big enough and He makes us strong enough. It's not up to debate there is no question about it, if God said it's yours then it's yours.

The problem with the 12 spies were that all of them were not listening to the right voice. Some were going this way and some were going that way. When you have division among yourselves you can't have revival. You can't have a break through and you can't get prayers answered because you are a divided house and that won't work or stand. It's time we listen to the right voice and get hooked up with the people of God.

If you have to be dragged into revival then you don't want revival. Likewise if you have to be made to have unity then you don't want unity. Therefore you're just like the 10 spies that listened to the wrong voice and we don't need to go there. There is too much at stake for this city, church, our families and revival. We can't be like the 12 spies with 10 going that way and 2 going that way.



We need to be like Joshua and Caleb. Let's get the job done. God said it's ours so let's take what is ours because we'd be fools to not take what is already ours.

Yes it's 2019 and there are all kinds of sin and corruption in America today but we still serve a mighty God. It may look like we are a minority but by God's grace we are a majority and yes the devil will park himself on our door steps and tell us not to get our hopes up and quit praying. Our only hope is to stop listening to the wrong voice and start listening to the right voice and that is the voice of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. For if God is for us, who can be against us!

Abraham are those who have faith in the promise of God (Romans 4:11-16). "Neither, because they are the seed of Abraham, are they all children: but, In Isaac shall thy seed be called" (Romans 9:7). Not all the descendants of Abraham were counted as Israel, but only those who came through Isaac, for Isaac was the child of promise.

Romans 9:8 describes the parallel between Israel and the church: "That is, They which are the children of the flesh, these are not the children of God: but the children of the promise are counted for the seed." Furthermore, not all of the descendants of Isaac are called Israel, but only those who came from his second son, Jacob. In this instance, the Lord changed the normal order of things before Esau and Jacob were born, saying, "The elder shall serve the younger" (Romans 9:12). The Lord magnified the second birth over the first birth. The natural seed came through the second child to make the type clear—only those who have been born again can be the spiritual seed, or the church.

The Gentiles are the spiritual children of Abraham through faith: "And he received the sign of circumcision, a seal of the righteousness of the faith which he had yet being uncircumcised: that he might be the father of all them that believe, though they be not circumcised" (Romans 4:11). Abraham was circumcised when he was ninety-nine years old. His circumcision was a seal of the faith he already possessed before he was circumcised. Thus, he is the spiritual father of all believers, whether circumcised or uncircumcised.

Romans 2:28-29 says, "For he is not a Jew, which is one outwardly; neither is that circumcision, which is outward in the flesh: but he is a Jew, which is one inwardly; and circumcision is that of the heart, in the spirit, and not in the letter." Those who have cut off the works of the

flesh are the spiritual children of Abraham.
Galatians 3:7 says, "Know ye therefore that they which are of faith, the same are the children of Abraham." Moreover, Galatians 3:29 states, "And if ye

be Christ's then are ye Abraham's seed, and heirs according to the promise." Indeed in John 8:39, the Lord rebuked those who trusted in their linage alone: "They answered and said unto him, Abraham is our Father. Jesus saith unto them, If ye were Abraham's children, ye would do the works of Abraham."

Therefore, the church becomes an heir to the promise of Abraham because of their relationship with Christ, who was the seed of Abraham. "For he is our peace, who hath made both one, and hath broken down the middle wall of partition between us; having abolished in his flesh the enmity, even the law of commandments contained in ordinances; for to make in himself of twain one new man, so making peace; and that he might reconcile both unto God in one body by the cross, having slain the enmity thereby" (Ephesians 2:14-16). The "new man" that was created by the death of Christ is the church, the body of Christ. (See Colossians 1:18, 24.) Therefore, the church has a right to the glory, the service of God, and many of the promises that God originally made to Israel, all because of Christ.

Beep, beep, beep, beep. The warning sound and flashing lights alerted commuter that the train door was about to close. Yet a few tardy individuals still made the frenzied scramble across the platform and onto the train. The door closed on one of them. Thankfully, it rebounded and the passenger boarded the train safely. I wondered why people took such risks when the next train would arrive in a mere 4 minutes.

When Esau discovered that
Jacob had claimed the
blessing that really belonged to him, he became
so angry that he wanted to
kill his brother. He planned to
wait until their father died.
Then when Jacob took over his
father's possessions, Esau would kill

him and have the land and cattle for his own.

But Rebekah still protected her favorite, Jacob; and she sent for him when she heard of Esau's evil plans. She warned Jacob to leave at once.

"Go to my brother Laban, who lives at Haran. Stay and visit with him a while, and then perhaps Esau will forget his anger. When he does, I will send for you to come back to us, for I cannot bear to lose both you and your father."

Rebekah did not tell old Isaac about the quarrel between their sons. Instead she told him that Jacob was going to seek a good wife from among their own people. Both Isaac and Rebekah were disappointed in the foreign women that Esau took for his wives, and Isaac agreed that Jacob should find a woman that worshiped the true God. Like most fathers, he forgave Jacob for fooling him about the birthright, and he gave him his parting blessing.

Bidding his mother and father goodbye, Jacob set out on the long journey alone. As he traveled slowly on his way, he thought of the trouble that he had brought upon himself. He was afraid that his own brother would kill him, and he did not know if he would ever feel safe to return home. He wondered if he would ever see his old father again. What good was the stolen birthright now that he might never be able to go back and take his father's place?

Jacob was sorry that Esau hated him and that he might never own his father's lands and flocks; but more than that, he was afraid that God was not please with him. He knew that he had lied, cheated, and stolen something which was not his. Perhaps he prayed to God for forgiveness as he trudged along his lonely path. Whatever his thoughts, we know that God was listening to them.

As the sun went down, Jacob probably felt lonelier than ever. He was very tired, however, and looked for a good place to stop for the night. Finding a smooth stone on which to rest his head, he lay down to sleep.

While he slept, God sent hem a wonderful dream. He saw a ladder that reached all the way from earth to heaven. On the ladder were beautiful angels, climbing up and down—from heaven, to earth, and back to their heavenly home. God Himself stood at the top of the ladder and spoke to Jacob: "I am the God of your grandfather Abraham and of your father Isaac. This land where you are lying, I will give to you and your children. Your family

will be great, with as many people as there are specks of dust on the earth; and through your family, all the peoples of the earth will be blessed. Now, I am with you and will be with you wherever you go, and I will bring you back to this land some day. I will never leave you until I make this promise come true."

When a person dies his body goes to the grave, in a state the Bible likens to sleep, to wait the resurrection, or reuniting of body and soul. The unrighteous soul waits in a place of unrest, while the righteous soul is as rest (Luke 16:22-28). The temporary abode for souls of the dead is Sheol (Hebrew) or Hades (Greek) (Psalm 16:10; Acts 2:27). When Christ rose from the dead, He conquered Hades and death, as a part of His victory He apparently led the righteous souls out of Hades (Ephesians 4:8-10). When a Christian dies today, his soul rests in the Lord's presence (II Corinthians 5:8; Philippians 1:21-24).

The next great event for the church is the catching away of the saints and the return of Jesus Christ (Titus 2:13). At the catching away (sometimes called the rapture) the dead in Christ will be resurrected and the living saints will be transformed both receiving immortal, glorified bodies (I Corinthians 15:51-54; Philippians 3:20-21; I Thessalonians 4:13-18). Together they will meet the Lord in the air to live with Him eternally.

An unparalleled time of great tribulation will come upon the world (Matthew 24:12; Revelation 6-19). Satan will seek to dominate the earth through a man and system described as "the beast" (sometimes called the Antichrist) (Revelation 13). The beast and his false prophet will establish a religious, political, and economic system to control the world. These satanic maneuvers will bring war, famine, and death. Eventually the beast will claim to be God and desecrate the rebuilt Jewish temple. Those who oppose this evil system and turn to God will be persecuted and martyred; some will have divine protection.

In the middle of the tribulation, God will pour out His judgment upon unrepentant, degenerate mankind by various great plagues (Revelation 6-18). Many believe that the church will be caught away before the tribulation, while some believe the church will go through part or all of it. In any event, the church will be protected from God's wrath (Luke 21:36).

At the close of the tribulation, the satanic armies will gather in the Valley of Armageddon to crush all opposition. Seemingly victorious, they will march to Jerusalem to claim their prize. Then Jesus Christ will physically return to earth with His saints, descending to the Mount of Olives (Zachariah 12-14; Acts 1:9-12; Revelation 19). The Jewish nation will recognize Him as their Messiah, and He will destroy the beast and his armies.

Jesus will establish His kingdom on earth for 1,000 years (often called the Millennium), and the saints will rule with Him (Revelation 20). Satan will be bound, but at the end of the age he will be loosed for a short time. He will foment a final rebellion, which God will destroy with fire from heaven.

The will come the Last, or White Throne, Judgment


(Revelation 20:11-15).
All those not in the book of life will be cast into the lake of fire (also called *Gehenna* in Greek), there to be separated eternally from God. God will destroy the present world and create a new heaven and a new earth. The saints will live with Him forever in the New Jerusalem (Revelation 21-22).

The Bible describes many signs that will precede Christ's second coming, and they are being fulfilled today (Matthew 24:1-39; Luke 21:7-31; II Thessalonians 2:1-8; II Timothy 3:1-13). The present age will soon end. despite different ideas about prophetic details, several key truths are evident from any literal interpretation of Scripture:

- 1. Jesus Christ will soon return to earth physically.
- 2. No one knows or can set the time of His coming; the church must be ready at all times (Matthew 24:42-44; Mark 13:33-37; Romans 13:11-14).
- 3. Every person will face Him in the judgment to receive either the reward of eternal life or the punishment of eternal death.

What is the proper response in light of these awesome truths? "The Spirit and the bride say, Come. And let him that heareth say, Come. And let him that is athirst come. And whosoever will, let him take the water of life freely.

. He which testifieth these things saith, surely I come quickly. Amen. Even so, come, Lord Jesus" (Revelation 22:17-20).

CHEF'S CORNER

Icebox Cake

INGREDIENTS

FILLING:

- 1 (8-oz) package cream cheese, softened
- 1 (14-oz) can sweetened condensed milk
- $1 (4^{1}/_{2}\text{-oz})$ box vanilla or lemon instant pudding mix
- 1 (8-oz) tub Cool Whip, divided

CAKE:

2 cups sliced strawberries 1 point blueberries, rinsed 1 (14.4-oz) box graham crackers Chocolate syrup, to garnish

STEPS

FILLING:

1. Beat cream cheese until smooth. Add condensed milk, and blend. 2. In a separate bowl, beat milk and pudding on medium, until thickened, about 2 minutes. Fold into cream cheese mixture with $^{1}/_{2}$ of Cool Whip.

CAKE:

- 1. Reserve several strawberries and blueberries for later use as garnish
- 2. Spread thin layer of Filling in 9X13-inch dish. Add a layer of graham crackers, trimming to fit as needed. Spread with $^{1}/_{2}$ remaining Filling, and top with $^{1}/_{2}$ the sliced strawberries and $^{1}/_{2}$ the blueberries.





Repeat layers. Top with last layer of graham crackers, and reserved Cool Whip.

- 3. Refrigerate at least 4 hours, or preferably overnight, and keep refrigerated until read to serve.
- 4. Garnish with reserved strawberries and blueberries; drizzle with chocolate syrup.

Heavenly Rewards

Luke 14:12-14

12. Then said he also to him that bade him, When thou makest a dinner or a supper, call not thy friends, nor thy brethren, neither thy kinsmen, nor thy rich neighbours; lest they also bid thee again, and a recompence be made thee.

13. But when thou makest a feast, call the poor, the maimed, the lame, the blind:

14. And thou shalt be blessed; for they cannot recompense thee: for thou shalt be recompensed at the resurrection of the just.

Children aren't the only ones who like to get rewards. Our Creator knows that adults are also motivated by incentives. His Word makes exciting promises for those who walk in His way.

Some of these benefits are available here on earth—like fulfillment, joy, and good favor—and other blessings will be bestowed in heaven. As believers, we need never fear the judgment (Rom. 8:1); we are clothed in righteousness through the blood of Jesus and will not face divine wrath. But the Lord will weigh the substance of our works and decide upon the reward we deserve.

To help us understand this, Scripture describes four crowns. The first, which is called *incorruptible*, is given to those whose great desire is to walk obediently before God. Through struggles and even failures, they continue to die to the flesh and fol-

low the Spirit. Second, the crown of life is granted to believers who stand firm, enduring trials without giving up or losing heart. Third, the crown of righteousness is bestowed upon those who long for Christ's appearing and walk godly lives through Him. Fourth, God will give the crown of glory to those who share His Word with others. And as the Bible tells us, we will be awed by Jesus' glory and honored just to lay our crowns at His feet.

The supreme reward is for us to manifest God's glory throughout eternity. We will experience ultimate joy in His presence forever, but we don't have to wait: we can invest today by serving Him obediently and humbly. Done with the right motive, service blesses us not and in our life to come.
